

EDGE Europe Retreat 2017 Organising Philanthropy for Systemic Change

Bergerie de Villarceaux, 14 to 16 November 2017

1. BACKGROUND, AIMS & PRINCIPLES

Two years after the establishment of EDGE Funders Alliance in Europe, we have grown into a membership community of 31 foundations from across Europe, working in different areas and parts of the world with the overall aim to position progressive philanthropy as a meaningful, responsible and inter-sectorally connected supporter of and actor for systemic change.

The yearly EDGE Europe retreat is an important convening to consolidate EDGE in Europe in terms of joint identity, membership, activity planning and governance. The retreat welcomes new members, integrating them in the community with the aim to strengthen EDGE as a political home for progressive foundations and a place to scale up the impact of our grantmaking.

The retreat is a safe space for in-depth discussion, learning and collaboration amongst the members on the role and challenges of philanthropy to address systemic change.

In particular, we aim to learn together and from each other, to initiate and deepen concrete collaborations, and to discuss and plan joint advocacy actions that can influence the wider philanthropic sector to address systemic change alternatives and shift more resources to this cause.

2. SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The meeting in November 2017 will bring together EDGE members with the following objectives:

1. BUILDING COMMUNITY - Understand individual members interests and assets for an effective joint approach, get to know each other's organisations and experiences and connect EDGE members in Europe
2. LEARNING - Discuss and explore pressing issues regarding the role of philanthropy in systemic change
3. ACTION PLANNING - Plan, develop and continue specific collaborations in topical working groups, strategic advocacy alliances or other collaboration formats
4. CHANGING PHILANTHROPY - Develop thinking and processes to challenge the philanthropy sector and how we address diversity, power and privilege to shift more resources towards systemic change and transformative actors
5. GOVERNANCE - Improve the governance, structural rules and mandates for the EDGE European Steering Group and the development of the EGDE community in Europe

Participants will be asked to prioritise these objectives when they sign up to the retreat, which will help to balance the agenda according to members' interests.

3. PARTICIPANTS

The meeting is a funders only space, open to all EDGE Members in Europe. Upon invitation, selected non-member foundations and a few philanthropic or civil society resource persons might participate.
